

3 indicators on biomass for the variable tranche

Baseline /Year 1 to Year 6
Baseline: 50% (2009)
Y 1 to 6: At least 5% increase in HHs using Tier 1 and above cooking methods
Baseline: Policy actions not implemented (2015)
Y1) Biomass energy baseline established, incl. use of cooking methodologies, forest
coverage and productivity, use of electricity for domestic lights, demand supply/balance
on biomass
Y2) Biomass energy Strategy updated and validated by MININFRA and SWG
Y3) Annual Action Plan of the Biomass energy Strategy validated and budget approved
Y4) National testing centre assessing cook stoves by ISO standard/Tier levels established
Y5) Regulatory framework for cook stoves (incl. certification, standardisation) approved
Y6) Biomass energy baseline updated, incl. use of cooking methodologies, forest coverage,
use of electricity for domestic lights, demand supply/balance on biomass and gender
Baseline: 80% proportion of annual wood demand sustainably met locally
Y1) Forestry inventory carried out with update on productivity and vegetation type
Y2) Baseline + (100-Bs)/20 and Y3 to 6) Previous target + (100-Bs)/20

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Key challenges and questions

- Cross cutting issue touching many institutions and stakeholders : how to coordinate them: Ministries (energy, agriculture, natural resources, trade, natural resources authorities), districts, municipalities, Private sector, households.
- Lack of reliable data/ indicators , regular statistic generation
- What key policy measures need to be supported?
- Should an institution take the lead over others? Should a new agency be created?
- Very informal sector which is difficult to organise and control
- Illegal imports of charcoal from neighbouring countries to overcome local strict regulation
- How to ensure the implementation of the decided policy measures and good governance?
